On a glorious, hot, sunny day Montenotte won the toss and put Stage in. Stage got off to a good start until Chris Fletcher was given run out when he was clearly in followed by another dubious decision when William Troughton was given out LBW on 43. Gwen Jones was also given out LBW dubiously having looked

comfortable at the crease, although having to limp when running due to a twisted ankle. Meanwhile Gabe Manthorp hit his maiden century for the club in just 81 balls. James Lawrence ended up on 45 not out whilst Jeff Davis and Tom Stanley put Montenotte's bowler Sunny Bowry to the sword. Both eventually out to Sunny on 22 and 16 respectively. Stage declared on 282 for 6 off just 38 overs.

Montenotte got off to an excellent start and at 6.30 at the start of the last hour with a minimum of 20 overs were 160-2 requiring just 6 an an over with 2 batsman well set at the crease. Some tight bowling from Jeff Davis (7 overs for 29) from the start of the last 20 overs enabled Mike Sadler to dismiss Steve Plum for 100 with a fine catch from Chris Fletcher then following up with the dismissal of Naveed Saed on 87. It was then a case of Montenotte seeing the overs through which they did with Paul Furness and Charlie Myers both still at the crease at the end of the days play.
